3 PROFILE

The establishment of the University College was initiated by Dr. John Buuck and Dr. Paul K. Fynn of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ghana in 1998.

It received its Interim Accreditation in January 2000 under the name University College of Wisconsin International University - Ghana (UCWIU-Gh). It was thus one of the first private universities to receive accreditation.

It began its operations in August 2000 under Rev. David Asante Dartey as the Director and Togbe Kwao Anipati IV as Dean of Academic Studies with nine (9) International MBA students, the first MBA programme to be run by a Private University in Ghana.

Wisconsin International University College, Ghana (WIUC-GH) has been accredited by the Ghana Tertiary Education Commission (GTEC) and is affiliated to the University of Ghana, the University of Cape Coast, the Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology (KNUST), and the University for Development Studies (UDS).

The University College has campuses in Accra (North Legon) and Kumasi (Feyiase, Lake Bosomtwe Road).





OVERVIEW OF THE 2020/2021 ACADEMIC YEAR - ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

Undergraduate Programmes

Wisconsin currently has two campuses; the Accra Main campus and the Kumasi campus. We currently have five Schools and two faculties: The School of Research and Graduate Studies, Wisconsin Business School, the School of Computing and Technology, the School of Communication Studies, the School of Nursing and Midwifery, the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences and the Faculty of Law. I am happy to inform you that in addition to our regular programmes in Business, Communication Studies, Nursing, Midwifery, Computer and ICT, law, Humanities and post graduate studies, Wisconsin has since the last academic year introduced new programmes such as BA in Music and Bachelor of Education in Early Childhood Education and Primary Education. The BA Music which is under the School of Communication Studies is already in its second year.

With the expansion of its skills Laboratory, the School of Nursing and Midwifery has positioned itself as one of the best if not the best nursing institution in Ghana and the West African subregion with its state-of-the-art facility and high-fidelity mannequins for practical learning.

It is with great delight I announce to you that, with final approval granted by the Ghana Tertiary Education Commission and our affiliate we have completed the change of name of the BSc Community Health Nursing to Bsc Public Health Nursing.

SCHOOL OF RESEARCH AND GRADUATE STUDIES

WIUC-GH's postgraduate programmes are designed to prepare graduates for strategic leadership roles within the private and public sectors in Ghana and beyond.

As you may be aware, increased competition in the job market has reduced the value of the first degree. In light of this, Wisconsin University has made it easy for its students to earn more.

I am happy to announce to you that in line with our goal of making quality education accessible to all and in an effort to mitigate the economic hardship resulting from the outbreak of the Covid 19 pandemic on students, our local MBA tuition fees have been slashed by over 50% from \$6000 to Ghs 18.000.

NEW GRADUATE PROGRAMMES

In response to increasing demand by students for shorter courses and duration for studies, the Graduate School is ready to mount the following new and market driven programmes:

One year MBA with options in:

- **Human Resource Management**
- Finance
- Marketing
- **Project Management**
- Accounting
- **Management Information Systems**

From January 2023, the Graduate School will mount new 1-year programmes in MSc. Real Estate Management and MSc. Business Analytics. These programmes would initially run concurrently with the existing 2-year MBA programme. WIUC-GH would eventually seek approval from the University of Cape Coast to enable WIUC-GH run MPhil Programmes in all options to enable students who excel in the one-year MBA programme and are interested in pursuing an MPhil programme do so for a top-up programme at WIUC-GH. Each of these new programmes will offer admissions each semester with study options for Weekday Evening Session and Weekends Only Session.

The Department Of Operations Management And Information Studies (OMIS)

After careful consideration of programmes that are currently running at the School, it has become necessary to pool together programmes that are founded on disciplines that interact very closely with each other under one department called the Department of Operations Management and Information Systems (OMIS). This is to achieve efficiency in the administration of such programmes.

This new Department of Operations Management and Information Systems (OMIS) will house the following programmes:

- MBA Management Information System
- MSc Logistics and Supply
- **MSc Business Analytics**
- MBA Project Management
- MSc Real Estates Management

SCHOOL OF NURSING AND MIDWIFERY

As of August 2022 the student population for the School of Nursing & Midwifery stood at 4,135 (four thousand, one hundred and thirty five) across three Bachelor of Science Programmes; namely, Bachelor of Science in General Nursing, Bachelor of Science in Public Health Nursing (Community Health Nursing) and Bachelor of Science in Midwifery at both the Accra and Kumasi campuses.

New Ultra-Modern Clinical Skills Laboratories

To give our students a competitive edge over their counterparts from other institutions and enhance their ability to have excellent clinical skills, the University continues to adequately resource the ultra-modern skills laboratories on both the Accra and Kumasi campuses. With our ultra-modern Clinical Skills Laboratories which are first of their kind in the sub region, we are committed to delivering a first-class instruction to students and providing a safe conducive simulation environment for teaching and learning. It is also noteworthy that WIUC is still being used as a centre by the Nursing and Midwifery Council of Ghana (N&MC) for its Licensure Examinations.

In addition to these, the Kumasi campus has been equipped with a Campus Clinic to provide first class healthcare to our students and staff.

Indexing

 The School of Nursing and Midwifery has registered a total of three thousand, six hundred and fifty-four (3,654) Nursing and Midwifery students with the Nursing and Midwifery Council of Ghana, through Indexing. This consists of Generic students who are Senior Secondary School Graduates and Certificate Nurses who came as serving officers to upgrade their certificates.

Licensing Examination

- The School of Nursing and Midwifery presented its fifth and sixth groups
 of students who have completed their degree programmes for the
 Nursing and Midwifery's licensing examination, in November, 2021 and
 August this year as follows:
- November 2021 277 students
- August 2022 216 students
- The School of Nursing and Midwifery has presented a total of eight hundred and twenty-nine (829) students for the Licensing Examination since our first batch was presented in February, 2020.
- Our Kumasi Campus is presenting its first batch of students for the Licensing Examination this year.

Below are results of the July/August, 2022 Licensing Examination for WIUC candi-

dates, as presented by the Nursing and Midwifery Council of Ghana. The executive summary of the pass rate is as follows:

Registered General Nursing : 81.1%
Registered Midwifery : 88.8%
Registered Public Health Nursing : 95.5%

WIUC As A Centre For Licensing Examinations Of Nursing And Midwifery Council

 WIUC is still being used as an examination centre by the Nursing and Midwifery Council of Ghana (N&MC) for its Licensing Examinations.

Nursing Access Course

 School of Nursing and Midwifery is still giving holders of HAC/NAC and NAP Certificates the opportunity to pursue Bachelor of Science Degree in our three programs (that is; General Nursing, Public Health Nursing and Midwifery) through its Nursing Access Course. Holders of Post Basic Midwifery Certificate are also given the opportunity to pursue direct Bachelor of Science Degree in Midwifery, without any Access Course.

QUALITY ASSURANCE UPDATE REPORT (2021/2022)

Training Workshop For Deans And Heads Of Academic Department

The Quality Assurance and Institutional Relations Unit (QAIRU) continued its mandate of ensuring the best quality workforce at Wisconsin University with a day's training workshop for all Deans and Heads of Academic Departments (HoDs) on 21st June 2022. The Training Workshop was aimed at equipping Deans and HoDs with current GTEC requirements for the processing of accreditation applications of both new and existing academic programmes as well as institutional accreditation requirements.

Faculty Engagement With QAIRU To Enhance The Quality Of Teaching And Learning

To meet its core mandate, QAIRU organised special engagement sessions with academic and administrative staff on separate days in July and August 2022 for each Faculty/School. The interactive engagement sessions aimed at sensitising and equipping staff with the requisite knowledge and skills on how to manage the key administrative activities of the Faculties/ Schools in order to improve the quality of teaching and learning at the various schools and faculties.

Implementation of New Strategic Plan

WIUC-GH is looking forward to the implementation of a new five (5)-year Strategic Plan, which is pending for approval by the University Council. The Strategic Plan seeks to provide a strategic direction that can make the University College more effective and responsive to its mission within the rapidly changing environment, especially after the advent of the COVID-19 pandemic.

KUMASI CAMPUS

Enrollment for the Kumasi Campus saw an increase in student population from 124 to 468 with majority of 372 being Nursing and Midwifery students as of July 2021. Faculty of Law had 63 while Business School had 33 students.

CENTRE FOR TEACHING SUPPORT

In collaboration with the University College of London (UCL) and University of Cape Coast (UCC), the School of Research and Graduate Studies on behalf of Wisconsin International University College is in the process of setting up a Centre for Teaching Support. The initial focus of this Centre will be to:

- Provide a centre of excellence in research and development of innovative teaching and learning methodologies.
- Organize periodic capacity building workshops/trainings for Lecturers on Critical Thinking.
- Serve as a reference Centre for Research and Development in critical thinking to contribute to the overall teaching and learning activities within the university.

WISCONSIN CENTRE FOR PROFESSIONAL STUDIES (WCPS)

In line with its plan to expand the Centre's scope in terms of the variety of courses in response to the different training needs of participants, the Centre of Professional Studies has chalked two major landmark achievement in the year under review, first with the introduction of Neurodiagnostics Technology training open to any capable person with a genuine desire to join the allied health field. The centre will offer training and treatment in neurological conditions such as epilepsy, movement disorders, dementias, cognitive disorders, strokes and cerebrovascular diseases, neuro-oncology, multiple sclerosis and demyelinating disorders, autoimmune neurology, pediatric neurology, headaches, neuromuscular diseases, sleep neurology and speech pathology with the training lasting over a period of nine months with three months of clinical attachment on weekends.

Secondly, Wisconsin International University College has been commissioned as the first centre in Ghana to run a paper based Occupational English Test for Ghanaian trained health professionals looking to practice abroad. Thankfully the first test was conducted successfully only some few days back.

The Wisconsin Centre for Professional continues to run various certificate and

diploma courses in Paralegal Studies, Advanced Investigations, Fingerprint Science & Biometric Science Studies, Crime Scene Forensics and Forensic Intelligence, Health and Safety, Music, Accounting, Banking and Finance with certification in ICAG, ACCA, CIB, FRM, CFA, etc.

MUSIC

Our music programme continues to attract a lot of students thanks to our state-of-the-art recording studio which has been christened the Legacy Music Studio. Modelled after the conservatory of the West, our goal is to become a talent-developing school of music; linking the academy, practice and business aspects of music to build in our students' entrepreneurship for the ever-growing music industry.

Aside from our flagship certificates programmes such as Piano and Jazz Studies, Audio Recording Engineering/Music Production, General Concert Instrumental Proficiency (Including Voice Studies), and Music in Worship (for Church Music Leadership) which are all currently being run at the Music department, I am happy to inform you all that admission is ongoing for the Diploma and Bachelor of Art Music which has been running for a semester now. Areas to be covered include: Film Music and Production, Concert and Events Planning. The Special Performing Artiste Programme, and Musicology.

CAREER COUNSELLING & PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

This University College believes in combining experiential learning with theory. Through internships, work placements and industry training provided at the Career and Counselling Services Centre, many of our graduates have had the opportunity to develop technical and soft skills relevant to industry.

I am delighted to inform you that the career development sessions offered by the Career Counselling Services Centre have been restructured with the appointment of a new head to continue to offer career services to students in preparing them for jobs and building a professional network in addition to its new role of providing guidance and counselling services to students.

INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

At WIUC-GH we are proud to truly embody our international identity. We have students from over 21 countries and staff from nearly 9 countries. From September 2017, WIUC-GH undertook to offer free processing of non-citizens' ID cards and residence permits for all duly registered international students. This is aimed at reducing international students' financial burden and the inconvenience of having to process these documents themselves. This is also done in order to comply with immigration regulations.

This year, by the grace of God, we are graduating a total of 1159 students. This is made up of 21 Diploma students, 1061 undergraduate students and 64 post-graduate degree students.

The **21** Diploma students are made up of 13 females representing **(61.9%)** and **8** males representing **(38.1%)**.

The undergraduate students comprise **731** females representing **(68.0%)** and **343** males representing **(32.0%).** The class distribution among the 1061 undergraduate students is as follows:

- **85** had First Class, representing **7.9%**;
- 449 had Second Class Upper, representing 41.8%;
- 308 had Second Class Lower, representing 28.7%;
- 170 had Third Class, representing 15.8%, and,
- 62 had Pass, representing 5.8%.

The **64** postgraduate students are made up of **26** females representing **40.6%** and **38** males, representing **59.4%**.






