The establishment of the University College was initiated by **Dr. John Buuck** and **Dr. Paul K. Fynn** of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ghana in 1998.

It received its **Interim Accreditation in January 2000** under the name University College of Wisconsin International University - Ghana (UCWIU-Ghana). It was thus one of the **first private universities** to receive accreditation.

It began its operations in August 2000 under Rev. David Asante Dartey as the Director and Togbe Kwao Anipati IV as Dean of Academic Studies with nine (9) International MBA students, the first MBA programme to be run by a Private University in Ghana.

Wisconsin International University College, Ghana (WIUC-GH) has been accredited by the Ghana Tertiary Education Commission (GTEC) and is affiliated to the University of Ghana, the University of Cape Coast, the Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology (KNUST), and the University for Development Studies (UDS).

The University College has campuses in Accra (North Legon) and Kumasi (Feyiase, Lake Bosomtwe Road).

SCHOOL OF RESEARCH AND GRADUATE STUDIES

WIUC-GH's postgraduate programmes are designed to prepare graduates for strategic leadership roles within the private and public sectors in Ghana and beyond. As you may be aware, increased competition in the job market has reduced the value of the first degree. In light of this and in line with recent trends and our commitment to inclusivity, I am happy to inform you that the university now admits applicants with third-class qualifications into our Master of Business Administration programme. Additionally, Wisconsin University has reviewed its MBA fees downward by almost 50% reduction.

The reduction in fees is a promotional discount as part of measures by the University aimed at mitigating the economic hardship on Ghanaian students.

This opportunity is here for you to seize as a stepping stone to your professional success. Please do well to also inform your other colleagues and family who are not here presently. It is important to note that all our programmes are fully accredited by the Ghana Tertiary Education Commission and affiliated with the leading public universities in the country, including the University of Ghana, Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology, University of Cape Coast, and the University for Development Studies.

New Graduate Programmes

In response to increasing demand by students for courses with shorter duration of studies, the Graduate School is ready to mount the following new and market driven programmes:

One year MBA with options in:

- Human Resource Management;
- Finance;
- Marketing;
- Project Management;

- Accounting; and,
- Management Information Systems.

Plans are also far advanced to mount new 1-year programmes in MSc. Real Estate Management and MSc. Business Analytics. These programmes would initially run concurrently with the existing 2-year MBA programme. WIUC-GH would eventually seek approval from the University of Cape Coast to enable WIUC-GH run MPhil Programmes in all options to enable students who excel in the one-year MBA programme and are interested in pursuing an MPhil programme do so for a top-up programme at WIUC-GH. Each of these new programmes will offer admissions each semester with study options for Weekday Evening Session and Weekends Only Session.

The Department Of Operations Management And Information Studies (OMIS)

After careful consideration of programmes that are currently running at the Graduate School, it has become necessary to pool together programmes that are founded on disciplines that interact very closely with each other under one department called the Department of Operations Management and Information Systems (OMIS). This is to achieve efficiency in the administration of such programmes.

This new Department of Operations Management and Information Systems (OMIS) will house the following programmes:

- MBA Management Information System;
- MSc Logistics and Supply;
- MSc Business Analytics;
- MBA Project Management; and,
- MSc Real Estates Management.

SCHOOL OF NURSING AND MIDWIFERY

As of August 2023 the total student enrolment at the School of Nursing & Midwifery stood at 4,135 (four thousand, one hundred and thirty five) across three Bachelor of Science Programmes; namely, Bachelor of Science in General Nursing, Bachelor of Science in Public Health Nursing (Community Health Nursing) and Bachelor of Science in Midwifery at both the Accra and Kumasi campuses.

New Programmes (Postgraduate)

The School of Nursing and Midwifery has plans underway to start the following three Postgraduate Programmes in the next academic year:

- 1. Master of Philosophy in Nursing (MPhil Nursing);
- 2. Master of Philosophy in Midwifery (MPhil Midwifery); and,
- 3. Master of Science in Nursing (MSc. Nursing).

These programmes have been designed to benefit all categories of nurses and midwives. Students who enroll for any of these programmes will be exposed to experiential learning with acquisition of advanced knowledge in research skills, teaching skills and improvement in practical work attitudes to function as nursing and midwifery experts.

The programmes are expected to commence in the 2024/2025 Academic Year. All Alumni and the General Public are encouraged to take full advantage of this great opportunity, patronize any of these well-tailored programmes and experience WIUC School of Nursing and Midwifery better.

New Ultra-Modern Clinical Skills Laboratories

To give our students a competitive edge over their counterparts from other institutions and enhance their ability to have excellent clinical skills, the University College continues to adequately resource the ultra-modern skills laboratories on both the Accra and Kumasi campuses. With our ultra-modern Clinical Skills Laboratories which are first of their kind in the sub-region, we are committed to delivering a first-class instruction to students and providing a safe conducive simulation environment for teaching and learning. It is also noteworthy that WIUC is still being used as a centre by the Nursing and Midwifery Council of Ghana (N&MC) for its Licensure Examinations.

In addition to these, the Kumasi campus has been equipped with a Campus Clinic to provide first class healthcare to our students and staff.

Indexing

- The School of Nursing and Midwifery has registered a total of five thousand, two hundred and eighty-seven (5,287) Nursing and Midwifery students with the Nursing and Midwifery Council of Ghana, through Indexing. This consists of Generic students who are Senior Secondary School Graduates and Certificate Nurses who came as serving officers to upgrade their certificates.

Licensing Examination

- The School of Nursing and Midwifery presented its seventh cohort of students who have completed their degree programmes for the Nursing and Midwifery's licensing examination in August this year as follows:
- August 2023 624 students
- The School of Nursing and Midwifery has presented a total of one thousand, seven hundred and thirty (1,730) students for the Licensing Examination since our first cohort was presented in February, 2020.

Below are results of the November 2022 Licensing Examination for WIUC candidates, as presented by the Nursing and Midwifery Council of Ghana.

Registered General Nursing : 86.3% 102 candidates presented with 88 passes

Registered Midwifery : 60% 15 candidates presented with 9 passes

Registered Public Health Nursing: 76% 17 candidates presented with 13 passes

WIUC As A Centre For Licensing Examinations Of Nursing And Midwifery Council

 WIUC is continues to be used as an examination centre by the Nursing and Midwifery Council of Ghana (N&MC) for its Licensing Examinations.

Nursing Access Course

- School of Nursing and Midwifery is still giving holders of HAC/NAC and NAP Certificates the opportunity to pursue Bachelor of Science Degree in our three programmes (that is; General Nursing, Public Health Nursing and Midwifery) through its Nursing Access Course. Holders of Post Basic Midwifery Certificate are also given the opportunity to pursue direct Bachelor of Science Degree in Midwifery, without any Access Course.

There were four sessions of the Access Course for this year's Nursing and Midwifery admissions on both campuses as follow:

BUSINESS SCHOOL

MoUs with professional bodies:

The Business School, as part of efforts at bridging the gap between the classroom and industry, has entered into agreement with a number of professional institutions to enable its students and alumni start their professional journey during their university education and while earning the prestigious professional qualification designation status. It is hopeful that the collaboration with these influential professional bodies will place graduates of Wisconsin University College in good stead to be competitive in the job market. These institutions include.

Pursue the establishment of the Entrepreneurship and Innovation Hub:

To enable the School reach out for grant from the National Entrepreneurship and Innovation Programme (NEIP) from the Office of the President. There are positive signs we might get the grant in the form of equipment and minimal working capital before the end of the year.

In its drive to increase student numbers, the Business School has considered research paper presented by one of its lecturers, Mr. Prince Kusi-Mensah in which he posited that we:

- We lay less emphasis on the age-old traditional newspaper and TV modes of advertising;
- Focus, more on face to face, word of mouth marketing by students.
- Enhance Quality teaching by lecturers;
- Efficiency in our internal processes both academic and administration.
- Financial wellness programme that provides students with opportunities that help them increase their knowledge, skills and confidence to become financially empowered;
- Virtual Entrepreneurship hub/Academic incubators;
- Local and foreign scholarships;
- Recruit via WIUC students' portal;
- Video marketing; Content marketing; and,
- Distance learning; On-Line learning.

Entrepreneurship and Innovation degree programme:

The Business School has approved a proposal meant for a new degree Programme in Entrepreneurship and Innovation subject to approval by the Academic Board, GTEC and our mentoring institution. We hope to submit the proposal at the next meeting of the Academic Board.

SCHOOL OF COMMUNICATION STUDIES

The BA Communication Studies programme continues to churn out very competent communication experts who are providing excellent services in Journalism, Public Relations and Advertising as well as related services such as Human Resources, Administration, Customer Service, Production, among others.

The School of Communication Studies has introduced a 2-year practical Diploma for those who, for various reasons, may not be able to pursue a 4-year degree programme. The School is also preparing to introduce a certificate course in broadcast journalism for practising radio journalists as well.

In response to demands from the public, the School has introduced a weekend stream in addition to its regular and evening sessions.

KUMASI CAMPUS

The Kumasi campus opened for students after accreditation had been granted for the institution as well as the programmes in Law and Nursing on 4th September 2019. Since then, the Kumasi Campus is making steady progress in its academic work as well as in the development of the campus in general.

Programmes Accredited by the Ghana Tertiary Education Commission (GTEC) are as follows:

- i. Nursing;
- ii. Law;
- iii. Business Studies:
- iv. Computing and Technology; and,
- v. Communication Studies.

Student enrolment at the Kumasi Campus saw a marginal increase population from 1346 (April 2023) to 1368 (October 2023) with majority being Nursing as of July 2021. Faculty of Law had 63 while Business School had 33 students.

Future Outlook

- The future of the Kumasi Campus looks very bright as commuting to and from Kumasi is much easier now, thanks to the construction of the main Feyiase road.
- More and more publicity is being carried out and the Campus is becoming known in the greater Kumasi area.

WISCONSIN CENTRE FOR PROFESSIONAL STUDIES (WCPS)

In line with its plan to expand the Centre's scope in terms of the variety of courses in response to the different training needs of participants, the Centre of Professional Studies has chalked a major landmark achievement in the year under review with the introduction of Neurodiagnostics Technology training open to any capable person with a genuine desire to join the allied health field.

OET Center

Wisconsin International University College has been commissioned as the first centre in Ghana to run a paper-based Occupational English Test for Ghanaian trained health professionals looking to practice abroad. Thankfully the first test was conducted successfully only a few months ago.

The Wisconsin Centre for Professional continues to run various certificate and diploma courses in Paralegal Studies, Advanced Investigations, Fingerprint Science & Biometric Science Studies, Crime Scene Forensics and Forensic Intelligence, Health and Safety, Music, Accounting, Banking and Finance with certification in ICAG, ACCA, CIB, FRM, CFA, etc.

MUSIC

Aside our flagship certificate programmes such as Piano and Jazz Studies, Audio Recording Engineering/Music Production, General Concert Instrumental Proficiency (Including Voice Studies), and Music in Worship (for Church Music Leadership) which are all currently being run at the Music department, I am happy to inform you all that admission is ongoing for the Diploma and Bachelor of Art Music which has been running for a semester now. Areas to be covered include: Film Music and Production, Concert and Events Planning, the Special Performing Artiste Programme and Musicology.

CAREER COUNSELLING & PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

This University College believes in combining experiential learning with theory. Through internships, work placements and industry training provided at the Career and Counselling Services Centre, many of our graduates have had the opportunity to develop technical and soft skills relevant to industry.

I am delighted to inform you that the career development sessions offered by the Career Counselling Services Centre have been restructured with the appointment of a new head to continue to offer career services to students in preparing them for jobs and building a professional network in addition to its new role of providing guidance and counselling services to students.

INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

At WIUC-GH we are proud to truly embody our international identity. We have students from over 21 countries and staff from nearly 9 countries. Since September 2017, WIUC-GH has undertaken to offer free processing of non-citizens' ID cards and residence permits for all duly registered international students. This is aimed at reducing international students' financial burden and the inconvenience of having to process these documents themselves. This is also done in order to comply with immigration regulations.

GRADUATION NUMBERS

This year, by the grace of God, we are graduating a total of **1533 students**. This is made up of **11 Diploma students**, **1406 undergraduate students** and **116 post-graduate degree students**.

The 11 Diploma students are made up of 6 females representing (54.5%) and 5 males representing (45.5%).

The undergraduate students comprise **1046 females representing (74.4%)** and **360 males representing (25.6%)**. The class distribution among the **1406 undergraduate students** is as follows:

- 96 had First Class, representing 6.82%;
- 580 had Second Class Upper, representing 41.25%;
- 475 had Second Class Lower, representing 33.75%;
- 207 had Third Class, representing 14.72%; and,
- 48 had Pass, representing 3.41%.

The **116 postgraduate students** are made up of **65 females** representing **56.03%** and **51 males**, representing **43.96%**.




