The establishment of the University College was initiated by Dr. John Buuck and Dr. Paul K. Fynn of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ghana in 1998.

It received its Interim Accreditation in January 2000 under the name University College of Wisconsin International University - Ghana (UCWIU-Ghana). It was thus one of the first private universities to receive accreditation.

It began its operations in August 2000 under Rev. David Asante Dartey as the Director and Togbe Kwao Anipati IV as Dean of Academic Studies with nine (9) International MBA students, the first MBA programme to be run by a Private University in Ghana.

Wisconsin International University College, Ghana (WIUC-GH) has been accredited by the Ghana Tertiary Education Commission (GTEC) and is affiliated to the University of Ghana, the University of Cape Coast, the Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology (KNUST), and the University for Development Studies (UDS).

The University College has campuses in Accra (North Legon) and Kumasi (Feyiase, Lake Bosomtwe Road).





Wisconsin remains resolute in expanding programmes to meet modern demands. This year, we successfully rolled out new postgraduate programmes in collaboration with the University of Cape Coast (UCC) and the University of Ghana (UG), including:

In response to industry needs, our Graduate School is preparing to launch a one-year MBA with specializations in Human Resource Management, Finance, Marketing, and Project Management. To widen opportunities, we have drastically reduced fees for local students and expanded admission opportunities into our MBA programme. This inclusivity reflects our mission to empower all learners.

ADVANCEMENTS AT THE KUMASI CAMPUS

The Kumasi Campus has seen remarkable transformation, with a new campus clinic providing healthcare services and the development of the Feyiase road improving accessibility. Student numbers continue to rise, affirming Kumasi as a strong anchor of our university's growth.

SCHOOL OF NURSING AND MIDWIFERY

The Wisconsin International University College Ghana (WIUC-GH) School of Nursing and Midwifery, with campuses in Accra and Kumasi, continues to play a leading role in the training of highly skilled health professionals.

PROGRAMMES

Currently, the School runs three Bachelor of Science programmes:

- Bachelor of Science in General Nursing
- Bachelor of Science in Public Health Nursing
- Bachelor of Science in Midwifery

New Postgraduate Programmes (Accra Campus)

In September 2024, the School introduced postgraduate programmes in Nursing and Midwifery. These are:

- Master of Philosophy in Nursing (MPhil Nursing)
- Master of Philosophy in Midwifery (MPhil Midwifery)
- Master of Science in Nursing (MSc Nursing)

In June 2025, the School successfully launched a Sandwich session for these programmes, enrolling 33 students in the maiden intake.

Acquisition Of A 3d Anatomy Table

Early this year, WIUC acquired a 3D Anatomy Table for the School of Nursing and Midwifery, leading to the establishment of an ultra-modern Human Anatomy Laboratory at the Accra campus. This new facility complements the school's four existing Skills Laboratories.

The 3D Anatomy Table is an advanced digital tool that enables students to:

- Explore life-sized 3D models of human anatomy.
- Perform virtual dissections, cutting through layers of the human body without the need for cadavers.
- Engage in clinical simulations and pathology case studies that bridge theory and practice.

This innovation significantly enhances teaching and clinical practice, positioning WIUC among the most technologically advanced nursing schools in the region.

INDEXING

In 2025, the school registered a total of 1,546 students with the Nursing and Midwifery Council of Ghana:

- 1,101 students from the Accra Campus
- 445 students from the Kumasi Campus

The next indexing exercise is scheduled for October–November 2025.

Licensing Examinations

The school presented its 11th and 12th cohorts of candidates for the Nursing and Midwifery Council's Licensing Examinations in March and August 2025:

- March 2025: 343 students (all programmes)
- August 2025: 799 students (all programmes)

In total, 1,126 students sat the Licensing Examinations this year—723 from Accra and 403 from Kumasi.

August 2024 Licensure Results:

- Midwifery: 84 candidates; 72.6% pass rate
- General Nursing: 348 candidates; 74.1% pass rate
- Public Health Nursing: 100 candidates; 96% pass rate

March 2025 Licensure Results:

Results have been released to candidates, but the official synopsis is yet to be received by the University.

Nursing Access Course

The Nursing Access Course continues to provide opportunities for holders of HAC/NAC/NAP certificates to pursue BSc programmes in General Nursing, Public Health Nursing, and Midwifery.

For 2025, three sessions of the Access Course were held on each campus:

Accra Campus:

- January – 240 students
- April – 320 students
- July – 131 students

Kumasi Campus:

- January – 281 students
- April – 392 students
- July – 148 students

Total Enrolment:

- Accra – 701 students
- Kumasi – 821 students

Admissions for the October 2025 Access Course are currently ongoing on both campuses.

The Business School continues to be one of the flagship faculties of the University in fulfilling its core mission of producing competent and industry – future-ready business leaders in Ghana.

The Business School has deepened its engagement with the community by hosting 38 students from the University of Bielefeld, Germany for a one-day seminar on International Diaconia and a 3-day seminar on Ethical Leadership for 33 Bishops from 15 African countries from 30th September to 3rd October, 2024. The seminar with Bishops was organized in collaboration with All Africa Conference of Churches, Kenya.

The school also organized a one-day seminar on the 21st Century Business Schools and how to make it relevant. It was addressed Prof. John Gatsi, of UCC. Business School and Ms. Sena Dake, the President of the Institute of Chartered Accountants, Ghana. WIUC - Business Students Association.

CHARTERED INSTITUTE OF BUSINESS (CIB) AWARD

The Achievers Club of the School participated and came second in the Business Challenge award organized by CIB.

FACULTY OF HUMANITIES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES

The first batch of Level 400 B.Ed. Early Childhood Education and B.Ed. Education Primary Education students completed their off-campus teaching practice last semester (February-April 2025). The second batch of students has currently started theirs and will be completing the exercise by the end of November 2025.

The Development and Environmental Studies Department signed a Collaborative Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Sustainable Development Alliance (SusDA) to promote research collaboration, undertake publications, environmental education, facilitate short courses, etc., for students.

FACULTY OF HUMANITIES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES (FHSS)

The FHSS comprises the Departments of Development and Environmental Studies, Economics, Language Arts, and Education Studies. Key developments include:

The FHSS successfully completed an off-campus teaching practice (Feb–Apr 2025) by the first batch of Level 400 B.Ed. Early Childhood Education and B.Ed. Primary Education students. A second batch is currently undertaking the exercise and will complete it by November 2025.

The faculty also signed a collaborative MoU between the Department of Development and Environmental Studies and the Sustainable Development Alliance (SusDA) to promote research, publications, environmental education, and short courses.

SCHOOL OF COMMUNICATION STUDIES (SCS)

The School of Communication Studies among key activities for the year organized a Fireside Chat with Sir Sam Jonah, a distinguished businessman, leader, and global citizen, on Wednesday, 24th September 2025, under the theme “My Leadership Journey.” The semi-formal, interactive session provided an opportunity for students, faculty, and the broader university community to engage with Sir Sam Jonah as he shared invaluable insights on leadership, innovation, corporate governance, entrepreneurship, and family life. The event inspired participants to embrace excellence, ethical leadership, and visionary thinking in their personal and professional pursuits.

Strategic Collaborations and Partnerships

The School of Communication Studies has strengthened its industry engagement through new partnerships on both the Accra and Kumasi campuses.

- The Kumasi Campus has signed a one-year collaboration agreement with Akoma FM, a subsidiary of Media General Radio Limited. Under this agreement, Akoma FM will provide internship placements, mentorship, and media production exposure for Wisconsin students, while also serving as the official Media Partner for the University’s major events and activities. In return, Wisconsin will offer periodic training sessions to enhance the presentation and production skills of Akoma FM’s staff, and make qualified faculty members available as resource persons for Akoma FM programmes. The partnership also includes academic and professional support in areas of mutual interest.

- In Accra, an impending two-year collaboration between Radio Unvers and Wisconsin's School of Communication Studies will provide a professional environment for student training and internships. Radio Unvers will allocate airtime for student-led shows, offer technical support, mentorship, and editorial guidance, and ensure adherence to professional, ethical, and regulatory standards.

Wisconsin SCS will, in turn, nominate eligible students, provide academic supervision, and ensure that participants uphold the highest standards of journalism and ethical conduct.

FCF Scholarship Awards

Six (6) students from the School of Communication Studies were recipients of the 2024 FCF Scholarship, and have successfully received their awards. The FCF (Future Communicators Foundation) is an initiative of The PR Trust, a Canada-based non-profit organization that supports young communication professionals through scholarships, awards, and networking opportunities. The scholarship covers tuition for four semesters and focuses on promoting social responsibility, sustainability, and leadership in communication practice.

Music and Cultural Engagement

As part of the University's 25th Anniversary Celebrations, the Music Department of the School of Communication Studies, in collaboration with the Ghana Jazz Foundation and the Ghana Jazz Collective, organized a memorable event dubbed "Jazz Nite @ Wisconsin." The event brought together management, staff, students, diplomats, representatives from Copyright Ghana, the University of Ghana's Music Department, and students from West African Senior High School, among others. The evening celebrated musical excellence, cultural diversity, and Wisconsin's commitment to the creative arts.

INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

During the year, the Office fostered collaboration with the University of Iringa (Uoi), Tanzania. In March 2025, a delegation of eight, including Uoi's Vice-Chancellor, visited WIUC. Following this, the President appointed a six-member committee to draft an MoU.

Key Areas of Agreement with Uoi:

1. Support for establishing a School of Nursing at Uoi, including curriculum development, infrastructure planning, equipment identification, qualification framework preparation, funding support, and training of selected Uoi staff through WIUC's MPhil Nursing programme.
2. Support for revamping Uoi's Information Technology programme, including curriculum redesign, equipment guidance, and qualification framework input.
3. Collaborative initiatives such as student and faculty exchanges, joint research, organization of conferences, and other mutually agreed academic activities.

Plans for 2025/2026 Academic Year:

The International Affairs Office has earmarked an ERASMUS+ European University collaboration with WIUC's School of Computing and Technology. This partnership will focus on student and faculty mobility.

OVERVIEW OF PROGRAMMES

Wisconsin continues to offer a rich portfolio of undergraduate and postgraduate programmes

To ensure efficiency, we have established the Department of Operations Management and Information Systems (OMIS) to house interrelated programmes such as MIS, Business Analytics, Project Management, and Real Estate.

GRADUATION DATA

This year, by the grace of God, we are graduating a grand total of 1864 students made up of 1376 students for Accra campus and 488 students for Kumasi campus. This number comprises 23 Diploma students, 1673 undergraduate students and 168 post-graduate degree students. The 23 Diploma students are made up of 12 females representing (52.17%) and 11 males representing (47.83%).

The undergraduate students comprise 1287 females representing (76.93%) and 386 males representing (23.07%). The class distribution among the 1673 undergraduate students is as follows:

- 137 had First Class, representing 8.19%;
- 643 had Second Class Upper, representing 38.43%;
- 610 had Second Class Lower, representing 36.46%;
- 232 had Third Class, representing 13.87%; and,
- 51 had Pass, representing 3.05%.

The 168 postgraduate students are made up of 55 females representing 32.74% and 113 males, representing 67.26%.

These statistics reaffirm our commitment to academic excellence and inclusivity.

We are also deepening partnerships with professional bodies such as the Institute of Chartered Accountants and the Chartered Institute of Bankers, and strengthening our Entrepreneurship and Innovation Hub to nurture job creators, not just job seekers.


